

Thank you for adopting a shelter animal. Because most of these animals are strays, we have no previous medical or vaccination history. Therefore, we recommend taking your new pet to a veterinarian for a complete check-up within 72 hours of adoption. If you do not have a regular veterinarian, check your information packet for a list of veterinarians that may offer a complimentary first exam. We also recommend that your new pet have a series of vaccinations to properly protect it from disease. The next set of vaccinations should be given by your veterinarian. If your new pet should become ill within 2 weeks of the adoption date (provided it has seen a veterinarian within the first 3 days), you can return the animal and take up to 6 months to find a replacement. Unfortunately, we are unable to give refunds or give reimbursements for any medical expenses incurred if treatment is sought. Please contact us if your pet becomes ill. Do not bath your new pet for 5 to 7 days after surgery or until the sutures have been removed. Watch the incision for any redness, swelling, or discharge. Physical activity should be kept to a minimum for a few days to allow full recovery from the surgery. We hope you enjoy the new addition to your family!
